I don't understand all the worry about recording the class and section. This is NOT required for Field Day, there is no log checking, the only requirement is to record enough information to eliminate any dupes in you score. If you just use WSJT-x, JTAlert, and N1MM+ with the standard sequence the frequency, mode and call are filled in correctly. That is the information you need to eliminate dupes. The class and section are left blank and the points are correctly set to 2.

We will send "3A PAC 73" for the final message. If the other station sends a class and section we will enter them by hand into N1MM+, if they don't then we will leave the fields blank. We always work lots of DX that do not send the "1D DX" exchange and we also work US/Canada stations that are not in the contest and do not send the exchange, those qso's have always counted.

WARAC General Meeting Minutes June 12th, 2018

The General Meeting was called to order at 7:05pm by President Mike, WO9B.

The minutes for the Board Meeting and the Membership meeting were approved.

Mike, WO9B, asked for comments about the Dayton Hamvention held last month. Barb, KD9HPS, talked a little about her trip to the Hamvention, and her quest to get information about bringing new, younger members into the club. John, N9LGD, talked about the 1Kw autotuner that he bought there.

Howard, WA9AXQ, announced the 2018 winner of the David Knaus Memorial Scholarship, John Fuller, KD9DMN, of Pewaukee, WI. He is a senior at Marquette University majoring in Mechanical Engineering. Mike, WO9B, and his son Matthew personally know John.

Mike, WO9B, discussed the proposal to purchase a new Video Projector for the Club. Jim, WB9IXS, asked if there were funds available to make the purchase. Bill, N9KPH, indicated the general fund balance, and then Jim made a motion to accept the proposal. Barb, KD9HPS, seconded the motion. A voice vote was held, and passed unanimously.

5. Mike, WO9B, indicated that Saturday dinner menu was pulled pork sandwiches, baked beans, and coleslaw. For dessert Barb brought Lemon Bars, and Howard brought Brownies. The Sunday morning menu would be Pancakes and bacon and sausages by Mike, and Donuts by Phil, W9NAW. Phil will also bring the coffee.

Field Day 2018 By Chuck Dellis, W9WLX, Field Day Chairman

Field Day 2018 is a wrap! We tried a few new things this year, piquing the interests of our Field Day teams. We had a successful event resulting in an even better experience. This year we did 965 QSOs vs. last year's 1,115, not including the GOTA station with 156 QSOs. Our overall numbers were down 13% over last year.

Our site was visited by New Berlin Mayor, Dave Ament, and Emergency Management Deputy Director, Jim Burns, KD9CIV. Thanks to Erwin von der Ehe for driving the awareness of Field Day with the New Berlin municipal government. For the fourth year, a Proclamation to officially recognize and designate June 23 & 24 as Amateur Radio Weekend was made by Mayor Ament.

Antenna locations were similar to last year; however, the station campers were co-located next to each other as well as the food tent. Arranging it this way made it easier for visitors and participants to move between stations, improved accessibility to food and refreshments, and promoted a better team environment overall.

New for this year was a GOTA station. Thanks to Barb and Dave Garnier for hosting the activity. The GOTA tent was a big visitor attraction. Barb did a great job attending educational sessions in Dayton and preparing instructional aides for the audience. Four youths took part.

The stations ran on the same antenna farm as last year. 10 meter operation shifted to the 40/15 station as the 80/20 station's loop did not load up on 28 MHz. Additionally, digital QSOs were worked from the 6 meter station using a whip vertical with a Wolf River coil, bumping us into the 3A class. The last change was upgrading last year's Flex 6500 to a Flex 6600 with two spectral capture units. Using the Wolf River vertical, diversity receive was used on 40 meters during the overnight hours receiving stations in both vertical and horizontal polarizations, minimizing QSB.

Short description of station setup:

- Icom 7600 for the 80/20 station, using 80 meter loop

- Flex 6600 for 40/15/10 station, using multi-band dipole and Wolf River vertical

- Icom 7100 for the 6 meter and digital station, using 6 m Yagi and loop, Wolf River vertical for HF

- Icom 7300 for the GOTA station, using vertical rover antenna design

We worked 76 of 83 sections. The seven missing sections were Alaska, Idaho, Manitoba, Newfoundland/Labrador, Northern Territories, San Francisco, and Saskatchewan.

Thanks to the entire WARAC team that help made
