

GENERAL COMMENTS

It was an interesting year for WIQP to say the least. Some new records and one big surprise, although a pleasant one - for the first time ever, a single operator MOBILE station has scored the most points ever generated as a single operator entry in WIQP, and not only that, he did it with a strictly CW entry.

We did have some rather cold weather that almost stopped several mobiles from doing their routes, which would have prevented the rest of us from being able to get those additional contacts. Comments like - "mounting antennas at minus 7 degrees with 15 mph winds on Sunday morning" - "the short duration blizzard on Saturday nearly caused us to cancel the trip" - "coldest I can remember in 11 years of doing this mobile" - "couldn't open any windows due to cold" - "a lot of new snow on the day before the contest and a wind chill factor of minus 25" - "those temps create VERY BRIEF pit stops" - shows what a mobile encounters "and of course Wisconsin weather in March can be anybody's guess." It sure looks like the last several WIQP's have been plagued by weather problems.

Even allowing for the weather, 31 mobile stations took to the WI highways, several of them from adjacent states. Those mobiles covered a combined total of 247 counties, with the top number visited by any one of them being our winner, who started in the western side of the state and crisscrossed the state traveling thru 21 counties before he was back at home. A number of mobiles had county totals in the double digits. Mobile stations are a really big part of what gives WIPQ its high level of participation. For example, when I look at the logs of some of the out of state stations, I find that a number of them have perhaps one third to one half, or more, of their contacts with the same mobile stations over and over. I think that keeps the participation from the out of state stations at a high level. So many mobile stations doing so many counties sure does help WIQP in being one of the best QSO parties in the USA.

Our many fixed Wisconsin stations also provide a big part of the high level of participation. This year we had 93 fixed stations send in logs. That high level of participation from Wisconsin fixed stations is the other half of the effort that WI stations put out on behalf of WIQP.

We continue to believe that the WIQP method of having one <u>overall</u> winner in each of three areas, is the way to go - as we believe that has provided the incentive to stations to not only participate in WIQP but raise the competition level a notch or two. We award a plaque to the highest score from a Wisconsin club, a plaque to the highest score from a Wisconsin single operator station and a plaque to the highest score from an out of state single operator station. We think if you ask any winner to see their plaque that you will find it in a place of honor, based on comments we have had from winners after us awarding it to them.

Now on to the specifics. The plaque for the Wisconsin Club Competition. We had entries from 27 WI clubs (we use 50 miles around the club center, except for mobile stations), with lots of effort by the participants. Fond du Lac Amateur Radio Club came out on top by putting together an effort from 13 members that resulted in their having a combined score of 714,889.5 points, which is a new record. The previous record was set in 2001. Congratulations to the Fond du Lac ARC. I am sure you will enjoy your plaque.



The plaque for the highest score by a single operator in Wisconsin goes to all CW, mobile station K5OT, Larry Hammel, who used a Kenwood TS850 with Hustler antennas while bouncing thru 21 counties. His 651 CW Qs with 82 multipliers and bonus points gave him a final score of 170,146 points. He has become the first mobile single operator station to score first in WIQP history. Larry also set a new record in the Single Operator Mobile category, breaking the old record set in 2001. Congratulations to Larry, who lives in Neenah, lest you wonder about the 5 call.

The plaque to the highest score by a single operator from outside of Wisconsin goes to Mike Tessmer, K9NW, who actually lives in Ohio. His 206 CW Qs and 91 phone Qs with 63 counties for multipliers gave him a total score of 47,533.5 points, which is a new record. He broke his own record that he set just last year. Congratulations Mike.

A new record was set in our Multi Operator Fixed category this year. The five operators operating W9EAU, the Eau Claire ARC call (using W0AIH facilities), made 269 CW Qs and 322 phone Qs with 104 multipliers, for a total score of 134,160 points. The previous record was set in 2002. Congratulations to KB9S, KI0F, KG9RA, N0BUI and KB9YFQ.

The last new record was set in our Multi Operator Mobile category. W9HB, drove in from Illinois to operate in Wisconsin. Their 617 CW Qs and 33 phone Qs with 80 multipliers and bonus points gave them a total score of 161, 540 points. They broke their own record set in 2002. Congratulations to W9HB and KF9D.

Our top Single Operator Fixed station this year was Fred Helmstetter, N9FH. He made 292 CW Qs and 297 phone Qs with 95 multipliers for a total score of 125, 542.5 points. Congratulation Fred.

Our top Single Operator Novice station this year was Alex Jasper, KB9TTO. He operated as a mobile station from 19 counties, making 35 phone Qs with 26 multipliers for a total score of 1,365 points. Congratulations

Our top Single Operator Technician station this year was Karen McDonald-Long, KC9BMH. She operated also as a mobile station and from 6 counties. She made 111 phone Qs with 14 multipliers and bonus for a total score of 4,831 points. Congratulations

Our top Multi Operator Multi Transmitter Fixed station this year was N9KI, the Bay Area Wireless Association call. Their 9 operators made 509 CW Qs and 893 phone Qs with 121 multipliers for a total score of 346, 846.5 points. Congratulations to N9LLA, KE9S, NS9R, KC9AXH, AA9PB, K8IR, W9YQ, KG8CX AND K0SN.

Our top Multi Operator Multi Transmitter Mobile station this year was N9EZ. They made 476 CW Qs and 66 phone Qs with 72 multipliers and bonus for a total score of 116, 444 points. Congratulations N9EZ and N9KS.

The overall numbers. We had 214 total entries, with 124 from within Wisconsin and 90 from outside of the state, and one check log from an aeronautical mobile station. We also received 33 state entries, three Canadian Provinces, four from Germany, one from Netherlands and one from Ukraine. We had 79 entries in



the Single Operator Fixed category, 15 in the Single Operator Mobile category, 5 in the Single Operator Technician category, 1 in the Single Operator Novice category, 8 in the Multi Operator Fixed category, 8 in the Multi Operator Mobile category, 5 in the Multi Operator Multi Transmitter Fixed category and 3 in the Multi Operator Multi Transmitter Mobile category. I would sure like to thank <u>ALL</u> the stations that participated for their efforts in WIQP for 2003.

An interesting note - our top 6 Single Operators in Wisconsin were MOBILE, FIXED, FIXED, MOBILE, MOBILE and FIXED.

On a slightly negative note I need to mention late entries. This year we experienced a number of them, which has caused us to be a bit late with our results. I would please ask that in future WIQP's that participants make an effort to get their entries in by our suggested deadline date, so we can get the results to you sooner. We would like to be able to continue using a suggested deadline date, but if late entries continue in the future, we might have to resort to a fixed deadline date instead.

One last thing. We continue to look at electronic submission standards. To date, there is none. With my retirement later this year, I hope to be able to come up with some sort of method. At this point it looks like a modified Cabrillo format will be needed, along with a standard printer friendly WIQP entry sheet. Stay tuned.

All in all, we think it was a very successful Wisconsin QSO Party for 2003. Thank you to all the participants who sent in logs and thank you to those who did not send in logs but did participate. We continue to think the WIQP is one of the best QSO parties and the reason for that is your participation. It goes without saying that unless you all are there for all or part of the 7 short hours, there would be no WIQP each year. Thanks again.

See you next March 14, 2004, good Lord willing.
