

Wisconsin QSO Party 2019 Results



Summary

As we approach the bottom of the sunspot cycle, this year's propagation conditions continued the trend we've seen the last couple of years. In-state propagation on 40 was limited at best and 80 meters became the bread-and-butter band. Wintry weather was a factor, with snow in the northwest part of the state that severely limited mobile activity in that area.

Plaque Winners

The WIQP lineup of six plaques and sponsors remains the same in 2019, but there are two things that are different this year.

First, the WIQP team has decided to award the Mobile plaque to the overall highest scoring mobile rather than the highest Single-Op Mobile. (Full disclosure: WO9B, who had the highest *Single-Op* Mobile score, is a member of the WIQP team).

Also, the VHF plaque will not be awarded this year because there were no VHF scores above the 500 point minimum stated in the Rules.

WIQP 2019

County Activation

Logs were received from 63 of our 72 counties, down from 70 last year. Most of the missing counties were in the snowy northwest area which has typically been covered by mobiles. There was some activity in seven of the nine "missing" counties, as indicated by QSO's in other logs. But there was no sign of activity in Barron and Sawyer counties.

This year, 14 counties were activated only by mobiles, down from 27 last year. This is due mainly to fewer mobiles, but mobiles did visit 45 counties, so their contribution is still very significant. Thanks to everyone who makes the extra effort to get on the road for our party, especially with questionable weather!


As in recent years, WIQP county activation data will be put on the website after the results are published.

Activity by Band

Log submissions for 2019 totaled 311, down about 6% from last year's 332. Wisconsin stations submitted 146 logs this year compared to 165 from out of state, about the same ratio as in recent years.

As you know, 40 and 80 are the bread and butter bands for stations in Wisconsin to contact other stations in Wisconsin. Beginning in 2017, we saw a major shift in that 40 meters went long early and 80 meters began to pick up a lot of the in-Wisconsin activity. In 2019, that shift was even more extreme with little in-state propagation on 40, even at start-time.

The chart at right shows the number of log entries between Wisconsin stations on 40 and 80 over the last seven years.




This time period corresponds roughly with the downside of sunspot cycle 25, so the big question is: what will happen as we move into cycle 26? When will short propagation on 40 come back? And also, when will 20 meters resume its role as a major long band as well as mult-producer?

The Activity by Band chart to the right is updated with 2019 data and shows a bigger picture of band activity.

It's interesting to note that logs are getting smaller.

Over the last three years, the average number of Q's per log has dropped from 98 to 88.



Category Results

Single Op Rookie (SOR)

This year's top Rookie is Greg Bielski, KE9UR, of Princeton in Green Lake county, with 13983 points on 158 phone Q's. The second place Rookie Ken Baker, KB9TT, (originally KD9JPV) in Sheboygan. Ken scored 2986 points on 52 QSO's.

Thanks to all the Rookies for entering WIQP! We hope you had fun and will be back next year.

The Rookie category, as the name implies, is to encourage newcomers to get involved and join the fun. Entrants do not need to be new hams - just new to WIQP. All entrants in this category get a certificate.

Single Op Fixed (SOF)

Chad Kurszewski, WE9V, in Kenosha county once again takes top honors in this category for the sixth consecutive year. Chad put together 157465.5 points on 594 total Q's, down a bit from 161066 points last year. Runner-up in SOF is Scott Dawley, N9SD, who operated from Sussex in Waukesha county. Scott accrued 146957.5 points on 621 Q's for his efforts.

Congratulations Chad and Scott, and thanks to all 128 (up from 122) SOF entries from Wisconsin stations.

Multi-Op Fixed (MOF)

Tim Rogerwall, N9BIL, and his crew from the Green River Valley ARS in Illinois again returned to Grant county, operating under their K9WM callsign. And again, they take top honors in the MOF category with 83535 points on 341 Q's and 95 mults. Their crew of five includes N9BIL, NN9K, N9YPN, N9MAT and K0NIA.

The father/son team of Kent and Scott Scheuerell, K9ZMU and N9HDE, also repeated their second place finish in this category. Kent and Scott are also in Grant county and they scored 47587.5 points on 237 QSO's.

Both of these teams are affiliated with the Hidden Valleys ARC in southwestern Wisconsin.

Congratulations to both of the above groups and thanks to the four MOF entries for your efforts!

Multi-Multi Fixed (MMF)

Jacob Feltz, K9TVG, and his grandfather John Feltz, W9JN, teamed up in Junction City, Portage county, and they submitted the highest score in this category. Jake and John made 380 Q's worth 69342 points.

Second in this category is the Wisconsin Valley Radio Association, based in Wausau. Joe Schoebel, KD9CJX, and company scored 6120 points on 85 QSO's. Congratulations and thanks to these two teams!

After many years, the W9EAU operation from the W0AIH superstation was conspicuous by its absence. No doubt this was related to the untimely death of Paul Bittner, W0AIH, last October.

We hope that "The Farm" will be able to live on, not only as a superstation, but also as a fitting tribute to a fine gentleman.

Single Op Mobile (SOM)

After doing some rover and multi-op mobile operations in recent WIQP's, Mike Johnson, WO9B, gave Single-Op a try and came out on the top of the category with 71428 points on 364 CW QSO's. Mike and his driver/navigators, Frank, KA9FZR and Mike's son Matt, KD9CVA, did a loop of 15 counties.

Jim Fitzpatrick, WI9WI, came in second with 44953 points on 267 CW Q's while traveling through 5 counties.

There were only four mobiles in this category this year due to less than ideal weather. Thanks for your efforts!

Here's hoping next year's weather is better and we get back to a normal mobile contingent.

Multi-Op Mobile (MOM)

This year Scott Jasper, NE9U, and his two sidekicks were back the Multi-Op Mobile category and they dominated! Scott, Art Wysocki, N9BCA, and Ron Feutz, KK9K scored 163687 points with 556 Q's on CW and 157 on phone for a total of 713. Great job under poor conditions!

As mentioned elsewhere in this report, the WIQP committee has decided to award the Mobile plaque to the NE9U team this year. This plaque has always gone to the highest scoring Single-Op Mobile, but Scott & Co. certainly deserve recognition for their performance this year as well as in past years. Congratulations!

In the future, this plaque may be re-designated as Top Mobile (of any mobile category) or perhaps another plaque will be added. Suggestions welcome!

Multi-Multi Mobile (MMM)

Jim Callow, K8IR, and team-mate Eric Janssen, KG9GH, take first place in this category with 447 Q's for 98024 points while covering 10 counties in northeastern Wisconsin. Jim and Eric are perennial mobile participants in WIQP and we appreciate their support!

Second place in this category is taken by Timothy Hale, KC9FSH, and Andrew Skjoldager, KC9IZF, operating with the call K9TIT. Tim and Andy did 113 Q's for 9193.5 points as they made a loop from the Fox Valley area west, including Marathon and Wood counties.

Top Non-Wisconsin Single-Op

This year's out-of-state honors and a plaque go Tom Williams, N2CU, in western New York. Tom scored 23652 points on 177 Q's. Tom is very active in QSO parties and has the plaques to prove it. (Check out his QRZ page).

Jeff Miller, WB8WKQ, in Michigan, north of Detroit, is this year's runner-up with 20260 points on 160 QSO's.

Non-Wisconsin logs this year represent about half (159 of 311 logs received). Thanks to all non-Wisconsin participants for coming to our Party!

Top QRP Station

This year's QRP honors and a plaque go to a Minnesota station, Jim Lageson, NOUR, who made 94 QSO's for 16522 points. Jim is another long-time WIQP participant. Two years ago, he took the QRP plaque operating mobile in Wisconsin.

Second place goes to Joel Kluender, W9JFK, in Grant county. He received 13694 points on 87 QSO's. Joel is a contributor to the Hidden Valleys club score.

Overall, logs were received from 10 stations that operated QRP this year. Seven are from out of state.

Top VHF Station

The top single-op score above 50 MHz was turned in by the NE9U Multi-Op mobile group, who collected 29 VHF QSO's and nine mults for 391.5 points during their travels through 16 counties. Second place goes to Larry Peterson, WA9TT, with 315 points on 31 Q's and six mults.

After last year's WIQP, a requirement was added to the rules stating that the VHF plaque will not be awarded if the top score is less than 500 points. As a result, the VHF plaque will not be awarded for 2019.

This year 37 stations reported VHF/UHF QSO's, about 10 less than last year. VHF activity has been slipping the last few years and it can't be blamed on the sunspot cycle. In the past, there has been dedicated VHF-only mobile activity around more populated areas, especially the Fox Valley. What can be done to bring this back or promote more VHF in WIQP some other way?

Club Competition

The Hidden Valleys Amateur Radio Club in southwestern Wisconsin takes top honors in the club aggregate competition this year with 214662.5 points. In all, they had 10 participants including the two top scores in the MOF category, the Green River Valley (K9WM) group and the Scheuerell (K9ZMU/N9HDE) team.

The Ozaukee Radio Club is back in the rankings with a second place score of 194642 points contributed by six stations. Third place goes to our own West Allis Radio Amateur Club with 175200.5 points contributed by 14

members.

Thanks to clubs in and out of Wisconsin for promoting WIQP to their members. Keep up the good work in the future!

W9FK Bonus

This year the West Allis club call, W9FK, was activated by Phil Gural, W9NAW. Phil operated portable from Green county and he made 158 QSO's, 107 of which showed up in submitted logs. Note that the W9FK activity is listed under "West Allis Club – W9FK" in the club aggregate listing and is not included in the West Allis Club aggregate. Thanks to Phil for being W9FK for a day.

Log Submissions

We still get a few handwritten logs. We don't want to exclude anyone who wants to log on paper, but please understand that in order to process the WIQP results, all the log data must go into our database. This means any information not submitted in a usable computer format must be entered manually. If there is anyone in your family or your club who can help you computerize your log, it will be greatly appreciated. And please note that emailing a .jpg picture of a paper log doesn't computerize it. (We got one like that).

Also, please remember that whatever format you use to submit your log, it must contain all the needed information. For example, we get a few logs from general purpose loggers that lack the necessary county information. Check the WIQP website or contact us if you have questions about any of this.
